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



MicroSD card tray: Holds MicroSD card. Tray is installed on the product by default.

Pin for the tray: Open the tray by inserting the pin provided into the MicroSD card tray hole.

# Description of Each

The appearance of the product, as well as the printed and engraved information, may vary depending on the model.



- 3.5mm Unbalanced Port/OPTICAL OUT terminal: Connect earphones or headphones for audio output that utilize a 3.5 mm jack. Use an optical cable to play back music on an external device with S/PDIF-IN.
- **2.5mm Balanced Port:** Connect earphones or headphones for audio output that utilize a 2.5mm jack.

**Balanced Port for External Devices:** Provides balanced output when connected with an external device.

MicroSD card tray: Holds MicroSD card.

Type-C USB Port: For charging and data transfer.

Power/Volume: Turn the wheel to adjust playback volume.

Short Press: Turns the screen on and off.

Press and Hold - Turns the device on and off.

LCD Touchscreen: Display the screen, and touch it to start.

Previous/Rewind:

Short press - Plays the previous song or restarts the song. Press and hold - Rewind

Play/Pause: Plays/pauses.

 $\textbf{Next/Fast-Forward:} \ \textbf{Short press - Plays the next music.}$ 

Press and hold - Fast-forwards.

Home Button: Returns to the home screen.

## Power Management


#### Turning on/off Power

- Press and hold the [Power/Volume button] to turn on the device.
- While the device is on, press and hold the [Power/Volume button] to shut down the device. A confirmation message will appear.
- 3. Press [Confirm] to turn off the device.




#### Turn the Screen On/Off

- 1. While the screen is on, press the [Power/Volume] to turn off the screen
- 2. Press [Power/Volume] again to turn it on.



#### Reset Function

 In case of an unexpected device failure or freeze, press and hold [Power] for 7 seconds to force a shutdown. The device can then be restarted after the shutdown is complete.



## Charging

#### Charging via Computer Connection

1. Connect the USB Type-C cable to a computer to charge the product.



Computer may need to be turned on to start charging depending on computer specifications.

When charging via computer connection, the charging time may vary depending on whether the device is turned on or off. Some computers in power-saving mode may not charge the device. The built-in battery will gradually lose capacity over time with repeated charging/running-down. Do not use cables other than USB Type C cables. Using other cables

#### Charging via USB Wall Adapte

may cause malfunctions.

1. Commercially available 9V 1.67A adapters may be used for charging.




Fast charging: Maximum 2 hours 20 minutes (Completely run-down, Power-off,9V 1.67A adapter) / Normal charging: Maximum 5 hours [Completely run-down, Power-off, 5V 2A adapter] A fast charger of 9V 1.67A may be used. Using a 12V adapter will not charge the product and may cause malfunctions.


#### 3 5mm Unhalanced Port

1. Connect earphones or headphones to the 3.5mm unbalanced port.




#### Connect to the 2.5mm Balanced Port

1. Connect earphones and headphones to the 2.5mm balanced port.



#### **Balanced Audio Device**

1. Connect to an external audio device by using the 3.5mm Unbalanced Port and 2.5mm Balanced Port.



#### Connecting S/PDIF OUT

1. Listen to music through an external device by connecting the S/PDIF-IN-compatible external device using the optical cable and operating the product. Turn on the output format conversion function in [Menu-Settings-S/PDIF Conversion], to convert to the format that is set when S/PDIF connection is made and output.





At S/PDIF OUT, the DSD format is converted to PCM and played back. PCM can select output bit rate (16/24bit) and sample rate (48/96/192kHz).

The volume will be fixed at the maximum level.

The output format of connected external devices may differ so refer to the specifications of each device.

#### **Connecting to Computer**

- 1. Turn on the device and your computer.
- 2. Connect the device to your computer using USB Type-C cable and select one of the following settings on the device [Menu - Settings - USB mode]
  - Media Device (USB Drive): Transfer files from a computer to the device.
  - DAC Input: Listen to music on a connected computer through the device. (See Page 36.)





Mac users need to download and install Android File Transfer from the Astell&Kern website. [http://www.astellnkern.com > Support > Download1

For the best connection, close any unnecessary programs before connecting the device to the computer.

Do not use cables other than the USB Type-C cable provided with the product. Use USB 2.0 only on Mac.

Type-C-to-Type-C cable is recommended when connecting with a

Windows XP users require Service Pack 2 and Windows Media Player 10 to be installed for the computer to recognize the USB device. Download Windows Media Player and required Service Packs from the Microsoft website. http://www.microsoft.com

#### Disconnecting from the Computer

1. Disconnect the USB Type-C cable after file transfer is completed.



Disconnecting the device from the computer during file transfer may corrupt data on the device.

#### Copy Files (Folders) to the Device

1. To copy files/folders from your computer, select the desired files/folders and drag & drop them into the device folder.





Ensure the USB Type-C cable is properly connected.

Turning off the device or disconnecting the USB Type-C cable while copying or moving files/folders may corrupt files or device memory. File transfer speeds may be affected by the computer and/or the OS environment.

#### Delete Files (or Folders) from the Device

- 1. Right-click the desired file/folder, and then select [Delete].
- 2. Select [Yes] in the [Confirm File/Folder Deletion] window to delete the selected files/folders



#### Insert/Remove a MicroSD Card

- 1. Insert the pin provided with the product into the MicroSD card tray hole and open the tray by gently pulling to remove it.
- 2. Place the MicroSD card in the tray in the direction shown in the illustration.
- 3. Insert the tray into the device to mount the MicroSD card
- 4. To safely remove a MicroSD card, select [Safely remove SD card] from the Notification Bar or select [Dismount MicroSD card] from [Menu - Settings - System Information
- 5. Open the card tray and remove the MicroSD card.

• When inserting the MicroSD card, do not use excessive force. This may cause damage to the device and the card.

- Do not repeatedly insert/remove the MicroSD card.
- If the card is improperly inserted, it may become stuck or cause damage to the device.

Notes on removing a MicroSD card

- Be sure to safely dismount and remove the MicroSD card from the device. Not dismounting the MicroSD card before removal may corrupt data on the MicroSD card and device.
- Do not disconnect the MicroSD card during use. Doing so may damage the MicroSD card, corrupt or delete data and cause the

#### Notes on Using MicroSD Cards

- If the MicroSD card is not recognized or is not functioning properly, format the card, preferably as a FAT32 partition.
- Using cards other than the recommended MicroSD card may cause issues
- A MicroSD card is not included in the product package. MicroSD cards must be purchased separately.

## Firmware Upgrade

#### Wi-Fi Update / OTA (Over-the-Air)

- Connect to a wireless network.
- 2. If a new firmware update is available, the screen will prompt to download the new firmware.
- 3. Select [Update].
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to proceed with the firmware upgrade.



For Wi-Fi connections, see Page 44.

The firmware upgrade may not start if the battery level is too low. (A minimum battery level of 20% is required for installation.) Do not disconnect from the wireless network while downloading a firmware update. Doing so may cause data corruption and/or damage to system files.

If an error occurs or the notice in the Notification Bar disappears during an upgrade, download the firmware update again by accessing [Menu - Settings - Update - System Update].

## Basic Operations

#### I CD Touchscreen

- 1. This device features an LCD touchscreen that allows you to select options by touching the screen.
  - Use the touchscreen to access various features on the device.



To prevent damage to the screen, do not use a sharp object or excessive force.

#### Return to the Home Screen

1. Press [O] to go to the Home Screen.

1. Touch and hold, then drag your finger to the right or left in the home screen to display menus.

#### Notification Bar

1. Touch and hold, then drag your finger down on the home screen to display the notification bar.

1. Touch and hold, then drag your finger left on the home screen to display the current playlist.





#### View playback history

1. Drag [Down / Up] direction on the Home screen to display the playback history.





#### Moving Up/Down on the List

1. Scroll through the list by dragging your finger up and down.

The SP1000 can access and play back music files stored on a computer on the same network, as well as output sound through compatible speakers.

#### MQS Streaming Server Installation

- 1. Visit the Astell&Kern website and download the server installer that corresponds to your operating system. [http://www.astellnkern.com > Support > Download].
- 2. Run the downloaded installer and follow the on-screen instructions
- 3. Check the User Guide within the program for detailed information on using the MQS Streaming Server.



#### Connecting AK Connect Library / Speaker

- 1. Turn On the library to be connected and connect to the same network as SP1000.
  - Run the MQS streaming server on your computer.
- 2. Turn on the AK CONNECT function by pressing and holding [  $\mathring{\Delta}$  ] in the notification bar or selecting [Menu-Settings-AK CONNECT].
- 3 Press [AK Connect] on the menu



- A list of libraries / speakers that are on the same network with SP1000 is displayed.
- 5. Select a library / speaker to connect.



After selecting a library / speaker, select a category from the menu to display the corresponding music list.

#### Streaming and downloading music from your library

- 1. Select a category from the library menu to see your list of music.
- 2. Select a song to begin streaming.

  - A message on the Notification Bar will indicate when the download is complete.







## Listening to Music

#### Selecting Music

- 1. Select a category from the menu to display the corresponding music list
- Select a song from the list to begin playback.



Select [Folder] to search music by folder. Continuous Playing Time: Approximately 12 hours (Music: FLAC, 16bit, 44.1kHz, Unbalanced, Volume 75, EQ Off, LCD Off) Supported Formats: PCM [8~384kHz[8/16/24/32bit]] DSD [2.8/5.6/11.2MHz]

#### Listening to Music

- To search, press [Q] on the menu list and enter the title. The search result will be displayed.
- Playback history is provided in the order of most recent playback, but pressing [ ] at the top, sorts the music list by the number of playbacks.
- After selecting the [MQS] category, press [ ] = / ] at the top to sort the music list in order of high quality / alphabetical order.
- In the [MQS] category, the MQS tab shows PCM files of 24 bits or more, and the DSD tab shows DSD files. O MQS: PCM[8~384kHz[24/32bit]]
  - o DSD: DSD [2.8/5.6/11.2MHz]
- Select the [Folder] category to check the internal / external memory capacity and number of files / folders, and copy / move music.
- Press [ ] on the music list to add all music to the current playlist.

- Press [ ] on top of the music list to view the options. :
  - : Add selected list at the first / at the last / after the current song of Now Playing
  - : Add selected list to playlist
  - : Select / deselect entire list
  - : Delete selected list
  - X : Exit
- Turn the [volume wheel] to adjust the volume.
- Press [ ] during playback to pause and [ ▶] to resume playback.
- Press [ | ◀ / ▶ |] to play the previous/next file.
- Press and hold [I◀/▶I] to rewind/fast-forward the file.
- Drag the indicator to the desired location during playback.
- Press album art on the Home screen to display the lyrics.
- Press the [O] to go to Home Screen.
- Press [X] at the top of the menu list to hide the menu list.

## Manage Playlist

#### Creating a Playlist

#### Adding a Song to a Playlist

- 1. Press [Playlists] to display the list of playlists.
- 2. Select a playlist and press [+ Add] to display a list of songs.
- 3. Select a song, and press [Add] to add the song to the selected playlist.




#### Removing a Song from a Playlist

- 1. Press [Playlists] to display the list of playlists.
- 2. Press [ ] at the top, then select the playlist you want to delete from the playlist.
- 3. Select the track, and press [ 77] on top to delete the track from the playlist.



#### Playing a Playlist

- 1. Select the desired playlist for playback.
- 2. Press [ ] at the top of the playlist, select the music you want to play and press  $[ \triangleright_{\mathbf{L}} ]$  to add the selected list at the first / at the last / after the current song of Now Playing (go to [Menu - Settings - Playback Settings]). Press [  $\equiv$  ] to play the entire playlist.



#### Renaming a Playlist

- 1. Press [Playlists] to view the playlists, and press [ // ].
- 2. Select a playlist to be renamed.
- 3. Press [T] at the top of the screen to display the name window.
- 4. Enter a name for the playlist, and then press [Rename] to save the playlist under a new name.



#### Deleting a Playlist

- 1. Press [Playlists] to view the playlists, and press [ / ].
- 2. Select the playlist to be deleted.
- to delete the selected playlist.



## USB DAC Installation

The USB DAC function allows the SP1000 to be recognized as a sound card on a computer. Music from the computer is played through the device's headphone port for an enhanced listening experience.

#### **USB DAC Specifications**

- Supported OS
  - o Windows XP(32hit) / Windows 7(32hit/64hit) / Windows 8(32hit/64hit) / Windows 10(32/64hit) MΔC OS 10 7
- USB DAC Support Specifications
  - Supported Formats: PCM [8~384kHz[8/16/24/32bit]] DSD [2.8/5.6/11.2MHz]
- Control the volume with the SP1000's volume wheel
  - Playback is unavailable when settings exceed the supported formats. Volume control is unavailable when the LCD screen is turned off when using the USB DAC connection.
    - The Previous, Play, and Next buttons are unavailable when connected as a USB DAC.
    - Playback may stutter when computer performance is slow or the USB connection is experiencing heavy usage.
    - There may be issues with audio-to-video synchronization during video playback depending on the sound quality and operating environment.
    - S/PDIF (OPTICAL) is unavailable during USB DAC connection.
    - Volume cannot be adjusted via the Windows volume control. The volume wheel on the device or volume control on the appropriate program must be used to adjust the volume.
    - Install a dedicated driver to use the SP1000 as a USB DAC.
    - The driver file is located in SP1000\Internal Storage\SP1000 Contents\Driver. Before installing the driver, set SP1000 to USB DAC mode and connect to PC.

## How to Use USB Audio

Connect the SP1000 to a portable amp and DAC using USB Audio Out

#### How to Connect a Portable USB DAC

- 1. Connect product's USB Type C terminal and portable USB DAC with a dedicated cable
- 2. Press [ ] in the notification bar.
- 3. Once [ ] is activated, you can enjoy music stored on the device through the connected portable USB DAC.

The USB Type-C cable provided with the product is to be used for

The type of dedicated cable needed to connect to the portable DAC varies; please refer to USB DAC manufacturer instructions for correct cable type.

A USB DAC cable is not included with the device and must be purchased separately.

Depending on the OTG cable used, the connection may be unstable.

#### How to Change USB Audio DSD Output Type

You can change the type of DSD data that is outputted through the USB audio out.

- 1. Select a DSD output type in [Menu Settings USB audio].
  - PCM: DSD audio is converted into PCM before being outputted through the USB audio out.
  - DoP: DSD audio is converted into DoP before being outputted through the USB audio out.

The portable USB DAC must be able to receive digital input via micro USB OTG.

Audio output may vary widely depending on the digital input specs of the portable USB DAC used. This is not a defect in the device output and not a reason for exchange or refund.

When using DoP as a DSD output type, no sound may be outputted except noise depending on the portable USB DAC.

## CD Ripping

CDs can be ripped directly to the device using the AK CD-RIPPER (sold separately).

#### Turning the AK CD-RIPPER ON/OFF

- 1. Connect AK CD ripper to Type-C USB port of SP1000 using proper cable. Drag down notification bar and press [ ()] to use AK CD-ripper.
- 2. While AK CD-RIPPER is turned on, press [ 3 on the notification bar to stop.



The USB Type-C cable provided with the product is to be used to connect to the PC or to charge the product. Dedicated cable is not included in the product package. Separately

purchase a MicroSD card. Depending on the OTG cable used, the connection may be unstable.

#### Automatic CD Ripping

- 1. In [Menu-Settings-CD Ripping], turn on automatic CD ripping function.
- Connect the AK CD-RIPPER to the device and insert a CD.
- 3. Metadata (ID3 tags) for the inserted CD will be retrieved via Gracenote if Wi-Fi is turned on.
- 4. CD ripping will begin automatically after the metadata has heen downloaded
- 5. When finished, press [OK] when prompted to complete the automatic CD ripping process.

#### Manual CD Ripping

1. In [Menu-Settings-CD Ripping], turn off automatic CD ripping function.

- 2. Connect AK CD-RIPPER and insert CD, to display [CD] Ripping] at the bottom of notification bar.
- 3. Press [CD Ripping] and select file format FLAC or WAV to rip.
- 4. The Gracenote database will be searched for matching CD metadata after the file format is selected
- 5. When the database search is complete, press [Start] to begin CD ripping.

#### CD Ripping Results

- • : Indicates that CD ripping is complete, or that CD ripping was successfully completed after encountering an error via error correction
- X: Indicates that the song currently being ripped can be canceled by user.
- !: Indicates that CD ripping failed due to an error that can't be corrected, such as a scratched CD. Also indicates that CD ripping was canceled by user.
  - To search the Gracenote database, the device must be connected to Wi-Fi. Database access time may vary depending on the network environment.

Please note that metadata for certain CDs may not be available on the Gracenote database.

You cannot access the Home screen while CD ripping is in progress. The AK Connect service will be disabled during CD ripping. The service will automatically restart when CD ripping is completed. CD Music playback is disabled during ripping.

You can set the desired file format and ripping speed from the [Menu - Settings - CD Ripping] menu.

Several attempts at correction will be made for data with errors when the feature is enabled under [Menu - Settings - CD Ripping -Error Correction]. Please note that the CD ripping speed will be affected when this feature is enabled.

## Settings

The settings menu allows users to customize the device. The settings menu may vary depending on the firmware version

#### Setup

- 1. Select [Menu Settings] or select [  $\langle \circ \rangle$  ] in the notification bar on the Home screen.
- 2. Select the desired setting option.

#### Wi-Fi

Change wireless network settings and turn Wi-Fi ON/OFF.



#### Bluetooth

• Connect a Bluetooth device to listen to music wirelessly.





#### AK CONNECT

• Turn AK Connect on/off and set AK Connect options.

#### Equalizer

- Set the equalizer according to the user's preferences.
  - o PRO EQ: Preset EQ recommended by Astell&Kern.
  - USER EQ: Adjust the frequencies according to the user's preferences.



#### Gapless Playback

- Plays the next song without any interruption.
  - Gapless playback is only supported between two files with identical bit rates, sample rates, and channels.

#### Line-out

• Set the voltage value generated when Line-out is activated.



Do not use earphones with the Line Out feature enabled. Doing so may cause permanent hearing loss.

#### Left-Right Balance

• Adjust the left-right balance for earphones/headphones.

#### **Playback Setting**

 Selecting Music from the menu sets the location and way the song is loaded during playback.

#### **CD Ripping**

 Set the automatic CD ripping function, file format and ripping speed seetings.

#### USB mode

- Media Device (USB Drive): When connected to a computer, device appears as a removable drive.
- DAC Input: Output sound from a connected computer to the device

#### USB Audio

 Select the type of DSD sound being outputted through the USB Audio out to a connected portable DAC.

#### Convert S/PDIF output

• Set the output format to device connected with S/PDIF.



Output format may differ depending on the connected external device. Please refer to the specifications of each device.

#### Screen Brightness

Adjust screen brightness settings.

#### Date & Time

Set the current date and time.

#### Device Name

- Set the name of the device.
  - The maximum name length is 50 characters.

#### Language

- Select the display language.
  - Supported languages: English, Korean, Japanese, Chinese (Simplified/Traditional), French, Russian, German

#### Keyboard

- Select the keyboard language.
  - Supported languages: English, Korean, Japanese, Chinese (Simplified/Traditional), French, Russian, German



Supported languages may vary depending on your location

#### Power

- Automatic power off: The device will automatically power off after a set time of inactivity.
- Turning off the screen: Screen Timeout: The screen will turn off after a set time when there is no user input.
- Set Sleep Timer: Music playback will stop, and the device will turn off after a set time.

#### Download

• Select a folder for downloaded files to be saved by default.



The default folder is set when using AK Connect to download files.
When [Select Folder] is selected, the user is prompted to choose a
download folder each time a file is downloaded.

#### Update

- System Update: Update the device when a new firmware version is available.
- Application Update: Update the default applications installed on the device (including the Store) when new versions are available.

#### System Information

- System Information: View model number, firmware version, and data storage information. The MicroSD card can be formatted, mounted/dismounted and data can be deleted.

  - Check that the volume setting is above [0].
